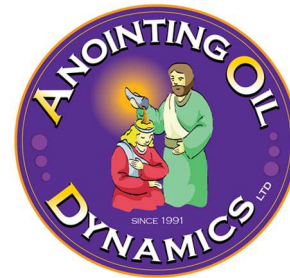

THE POWER OF DREAM

(Ps 119: 98-100)

Scripture: Genesis 37:2-11 These *are* the generations of Jacob. Joseph, *being* seventeen years old, was feeding the flock with his brethren; and the lad *was* with the sons of Bilhah, and with the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives: and Joseph brought unto his father their evil report. 3 Now Israel loved Joseph more than all his children, because he *was* the son of his old age: and he made him a coat of *many* colours. 4 And when his brethren saw that their father loved him more than all his brethren, they hated him, and could not speak peaceably unto him.

5 And Joseph dreamed a dream, and he told *it* his brethren: and they hated him yet the more. 6 And he said unto them, Hear, I pray you, this dream which I have dreamed: 7 For, behold, we *were* binding sheaves in the field, and, lo, my sheaf arose, and also stood upright; and, behold, your sheaves stood round about, and made obeisance to my sheaf. 8 And his brethren said to him, Shalt thou indeed reign over us? or shalt thou indeed have dominion over us? And they hated him yet the more for his dreams, and for his words. 9 And he dreamed yet another dream, and told it his brethren, and said, Behold, I have dreamed a dream more; and, behold, the sun and the moon and the eleven stars made obeisance to me. 10 And he told *it* to his father, and to his brethren: and his father rebuked him, and said unto him, What *is* this dream that thou hast dreamed? Shall I and thy mother and thy brethren indeed come to bow down ourselves to thee to the earth? 11 And his brethren envied him; but his father observed the saying. 1

GOD Use Dream language.

Don't despise dreams. God may be trying to tell you something.

Dreams have had a profound role in the Christian church since its beginning. Dreams are rooted in Hebrew history, and we have a rich heritage of dream language and revelation bequeathed to the Christian church throughout its history.

In brief review, to set the stage—what God did long ago, and throughout history, He does today and will continue always to do. Dream language is the language of the ages. This is one of the mysterious and communication ways that God intercept our lives. He invades our comfort zones. He visits us in the night and simply speaks to us.

Dreams, visions and interpretations are a part of virtually every culture and religion on earth and have been throughout the ages. This is even truer for Judaism and Christianity than any other religion, as Jews and Christians worship the one true God, who is the author of revelation. To accept dreaming as a legitimate avenue for spiritual revelation and communication, we have to review the history of those directed by dreams

Dream Legacy of the Early Church

Just as they had for the Jews in the Old Testament, divined dreams continued to play a significant role in the New Testament and in the life of the early church. Matthew, for example, records four dreams that Joseph received relating to the birth and early life of Jesus, as well as the dream to the wise men warning them not to return to Herod.

Luke in Acts relates Saul's (Paul's) vision of Jesus on the road to Damascus and the subsequent dream of Ananias, whom the Lord sent to lay his hands on Saul and restore his sight. He also mentions Saul's dream in which he is told to expect Ananias. Years later, Paul has a dream that results in carrying the gospel into the continent of Europe for the first time. Simon Peter and Cornelius, a Roman centurion, both receive visions that lead to Peter's visit to Cornelius's home, where he preaches the gospel to Cornelius and his friends and family.

After the deaths of the apostles and the passing of the New Testament period, church leaders during the first few centuries of the church remained quite open to dreams and visions as a valid avenue of God's communication with man. Many of them wrote of dreams and visions in a positive manner and some even recorded their personal dream experiences. Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna and a man who was a contemporary of the apostles and was ordained by them, was martyred for his faith in A.D. 155. While praying shortly before his death, Polycarp received a vision in which the pillow under his head caught fire. He understood that this image was a premonition from God of his own impending death.

Examples in Church History

Justin Martyr, the first Christian philosopher, believed that dreams are sent by spiritual being. He used this idea to support his belief that the human soul lives on after the death of the body. Dreams give us "direct spiritual communication with nonphysical realities."

Irenaeus, bishop of Lyons in the last half of the second century, believed, like Justin Martyr, that dreams reveal the spiritual world. In *Against Heresies*, his major extant work, Irenaeus provides critical and positive analysis of the dreams of Joseph, Peter and Paul in the New Testament. He also used his understanding of dreams to refute the idea of reincarnation. Since dreams connect our soul to the spiritual world, we should remember dreams from a former life if such a theory existed.

Clement of Alexandria, one of the most brilliant minds in the early church, believed that true dreams arise from the "depth of the soul" and that they "reveal spiritual reality, the inter-link of the soul with God." For Clement, sleep was a time when a person becomes especially open to divine revelation. Dreams can provide insight to a person's divine destiny:

"Thus also such dreams as are true, in the view of him who reflects rightly, are the thoughts of a sober soul, undistracted for the time by the affections of the body, and counseling with itself in the best manner. ... Wherefore always contemplating God, and by perpetual converse with him inoculating the body with wakefulness, it raises man to equality with angelic grace, and from the practice of wakefulness it grasps the eternity of life."

Tertullian, powerful writer and defender of the faith in the third century, regarded dreams as one of the *charismata*, or spiritual gifts from God. He also believed they were just as relevant for people of his own day as they were in New Testament days. In his view, dreams came from any one of four sources: demons, God, the soul or "the ecstatic state and its peculiar conditions."

Augustine, one of most brilliant minds and greatest theologians in the history the church, was a firm believer in the validity and value of spiritual dreams. He wrote that humans perceive reality in four different ways:

- First, there is the outer realm of physical objects to which we react with our physical bodies.
- Second are the mental impressions that we have of those physical experiences.
- Third is the inner perception of those experiences.
- Fourthly, the mental image in its remembered form.

Augustine believed that, in addition to physical realities perceived through outer and inner perception, humans could also perceive "autonomous spiritual realities," such as angels and demons, that presented themselves to the inner awareness. Augustine's writings contain numerous examples and discussions of dreams, both his own and those of others. One of particular interest is a dream that his mother Monica had received years earlier in which the Lord gave her comfort in the assurance that he (Augustine) would one day turn to Christ.

Thomas Aquinas, medieval theologian who rivaled Augustine, agreed with Aristotle's view that the only sources of human knowledge are sense experience and rational thought. His approach to theology was to combine Christian thought with Aristotelian thought and thereby to thoroughly modernize Christianity.

Yet, even while writing this massive work, *Summa Theologica*, Aquinas himself experienced both a dream and a revelatory vision. The dream was an instructive dream in which Peter and Paul instructed him on how to handle a particular theological issue he had been having great difficulty with. Near the end of his life, when his great work was almost finished, Aquinas received a vision, a direct divine experience that apparently exceeded anything his rational thought could have produced. The result was that he stopped working on his *Summa Theologica*, saying, "I can do no more. Such things have been revealed to me that all I have written seemed like straw, and I now await the end of my life. And this from a man whose utterly rational approach to theology helped turn the church as a whole away from sensitivity to dream language for centuries!

Dream Language in the Modern Church

Looking at the Reformation period - Beginning sometime in the fourth century and continuing for over a thousand years, the church officially turned its back on dream language in favor of a more "rational" approach to theology and doctrine. During the same time, however, many individual believers continued to experience dreams and visions of a divine nature, and a large number of the records of those encounters survive to the present day. In other words, despite the ruling bodies "official" anti-dream stance, God has continued to speak to His people through dreams and visions just as He did in ancient days. Let me share one Christian History example in some detail.

The Revelation Behind Amazing Grace

John Newton was one of the most respected and loved churchmen in England in the 18th-century. But his life did not start off in that direction. Newton grew up to be a seaman and later became a slave trader. Years later, as he was about to enter the ministry, he wrote about a dream he had had early in his slave trading days that both warned him of the danger of his way of life and gave him a sense of God's providence. In his dream, Newton was aboard ship in the harbor of Venice, taking the night watch. A person approached him with a ring, gave it to him and warned him to guard it carefully because as long as he kept the ring he would be happy and secure.

As he thought about these things, a second person came up to him and convinced him of the folly of depending on the ring for his security. Newton dropped the ring in the water and immediately saw fire burst from a range of mountains behind Venice. Too late he recognized the second person as the tempter, who had tricked him into

throwing away God's mercy on his life. All that awaited him now were the hellish flames of those burning mountains. In Newton's own words:

"And when I thought myself upon the point of a constrained departure, and stood, self-condemned, without plea or hope, suddenly, either a third person, or the same who brought the reigning at first, came to me... and demanded the calls of my grief. I told him the plain case, confessing that I had ruling to myself willfully, and deserved no pity. He blamed my rashness, and asked if I should be wiser supposing I had my ring again?

"I could hardly answer to this; for I thought it was gone beyond recall. I believe, indeed, I had it not time to answer, before I saw this unexpected friend go down under the water, just in the spot where had dropped it; and he soon returned, bringing the ring with him. The moment he came on board the flames in the mountains were extinguished, and my seducer left me. Then was 'the prey taken from the hand of the mighty, and the lawful captive delivered.' My fears were at an end, and with joy and gratitude I approached my kind deliverer to receive the ring again; but he refused to return it, and spoke to this effect:

"If you should be entrusted with this ring again, you would very soon bring yourself into the same distress: you are not able to keep it; but I will preserve it for you, and, whenever it is needful, will produce it in your behalf."

After a short time, Newton forgot this dream. A few years later, however, he found himself in circumstances remarkably similar to those in his dream when he "stood helpless and hopeless upon the brink of an awful eternity." There John Newton found mercy from the Lord. He discovered that the One who restored the ring would also keep it for him. This experience led him to exclaim, "O what an unspeakable comfort is this, that I am not in my own keeping!"

As a minister of the gospel, John Newton penned the words to many hymns, including one of the most famous and most-sung hymns of the church, "Amazing Grace." It was a grace John Newton knew from experience.

Let's Receive Our Inheritance!

Dreams are powerful language tools of Heaven. They can reach us, touch us and change our lives in a way that no other form of communication can. Don't despise dreams. Don't turn your back on them as so many in the church did for so many centuries. Open yourself to the world of dream language and, in the tradition of the Jews, expect God to speak to you through dreams, expect to remember what He says, and expect your life to be changed as you respond to what God says to you.

Like our Jewish forerunners and the early church fathers, let's create a culture where the spirit of revelation not only exists but also flourishes. It's time to take back our spiritual birthright and be sons and daughters who walk an illumined path by the One who is the author of dreams.

In Acts we were told of the role of Dream and its impact to the future events.

Act 2:16-21 But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel;

And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams:

And on my servants and on my handmaidens I will pour out in those days of my Spirit; and they shall prophesy:

And I will shew wonders in heaven above, and signs in the earth beneath; blood, and fire, and vapour of smoke:

The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before that great and notable day of the Lord come:

And it shall come to pass, *that* whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved.

How to identify the Lord's dream

- ✓ Dream is different from "day dreaming" which is someone allowing the mind to centrifuge their thoughts on one topic

- ✓ Dream is different from a nightmare which leaves fear and torment. This must be rebuked and bound.
- ✓ Dream is a message in picture using four for your five senses. (Smell will not operate)
- ✓ Joel 2:28 And it shall come to pass afterward, *that* I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions: 2.
- ✓ Visions are message in picture form that comes in a series of flashes. **Num 24:16** He hath said, which heard the words of God, and knew the knowledge of the most High, *which* saw the vision of the Almighty, falling *into a trance*, but having his eyes open:

Act 11:5 I was in the city of Joppa praying: and in a trance I saw a vision, A certain vessel descend, as it had been a great sheet, let down from heaven by four corners; and it came even to me:
- ✓ The Dream of the Lord result in the person being “raised out of sleep or they awoke out of sleep.
- ✓ Pharaoh in Gen 41:1-6; **Gen 41:7** And the seven thin ears devoured the seven rank and full ears. And Pharaoh awoke, and, behold, *it was* a dream.
- ✓ Nebuchadnezzar in **Dan 2:1** And in the second year of the reign of Nebuchadnezzar Nebuchadnezzar dreamed dreams, wherewith his spirit was troubled, and his sleep brake from him.
- ✓ Jacob in **Gen 28:16** And Jacob awaked out of his sleep, and he said, Surely the LORD is in this place; and I knew *it* not.
- ✓ Joseph in **Mat 1:24** Then Joseph being raised from sleep did as the angel of the Lord had bidden him, and took unto him his wife:

Kicking: to be the defensive in a struggle (Acts 26:14); reaction

Kidnapped / Kidnapper: an evil spirit trying to steal, kill & destroy (John 10:10)

Killer: an evil spirit that seeks your life of success (1 Cor 15:55); destroyer;

Kiln: a place of waiting and gaining strength under heat (1 Pet 4:12, Nah 3:13-15)

King: person in supreme authority can represent Jesus (Dan 2:37); ruler; leader

Kiss/kissing: intimacy (song 1:1-2, Ps 2:12) worship (Ps 2); to touch; show affection.

Kitchen: working hard to spiritually nourish others (Luke 10:40); Heated job; cooking.

Kite (flying on string): earthly prayer tethered to unseen answer in heaven (Ps 123:1)

Knees: symbolic of being on your knees in prayer (Eph 3:14, Dan 6:10) respect, submission

Knife: weapon (Prov 23:2) cut spiritual meat into bite – size pieces for teaching, see meat

Knight: a rescuer or deliverer, often representing Jesus (Ps 144:2); horse rider; leader

Knocking: something or someone, trying to gain entrance, maybe Jesus (Rev 3:30)

L

Labor: birthing something into life through intense strain (Jer 6:24) Events around a miracle and the return of Christ.

Labyrinth Maze: being lost, confused and trapped (Luke 19:10, 1 Cor 14:33) life in a circle

Ladder: occupational or spiritual promotion (Gen 28:12); Way out.

Lamb: Christ (John 1:29) young children or baby Christians (John 21:15); Innocence.

Lamp / Lanterns: Revelation and the Word of God (Ps 119:105); To shine; direction.

Las Vegas: a seat of sin, “Sin City” Sodom and Gomorrah (Gen 19:24-25); deception.

Laughing: the joy of the Lord (Pro 17:22, Job 8:21 Neh 8:10) cheerful heart;

Laundry: airing sin- dirty laundry” (Rom 13:12) secrets of the heart. (1 Cor 14:25)

Lawn Mowers: stewardship or maintenance of one’s fields (Isa 61:5, Dan 4:15)

Lava: slow destruction and judgment (Rev 8:8) Heat from under; slippery death.

La-Z- Boy recliner: sluggardness and laziness (Ecc 10:18) Lacking Vision;

Leaking: loss, draining situations and problems (Nah 2:8) unforgiveness; hurting.

Leash: restrictions or limitations (1 Cor 7:35, Job 41:5)

Leaven: hypocrisy or a Pharisee influence (Matt 16:11) actor in disguise

Left Turn: the opposite of the right turn is a ‘wrong’ turn or decision in life (Ecc 10:2)

Leopard: may represent a sudden, evil ambush (Hos 13:7, Jer 5:6) spotted garment.

Leprosy: rejection or being outcast (Lev 13:45); sinful nature; skin disease.

Letter: if to you, regard the message, if to others, things you wanted to say (2 Cor 10:9)

Leviathan: a large, destructive force or spirit (Job 41:1) serpent.

Library: a desire for knowledge of God’s will (Ecc 12:12) resources.

Licking Dust: enemies of God eventually lick the dust (Ps 72:9); low time in life; raw material; starting over.

Lie detector test: the presence of deceit or the need for truthfulness (Col 3:9) until observation.

Light: God's first creation (Gen 1:3) God's Word (Ps 27:1, Pro 6:23); revealing power.

Light bulb: a bright or creative idea revelation or wisdom (Luke 2:32) Channel for light

Lighthouse: hope when searching (Job 17:15) direction for the lost; something that stands out

Lightening: revelation or supernatural power (Ezek 1:14); rapid force; warning

Limp- handed: weak and without influence or power (Jer 50:43); help needed.

Limping: having wrestled with God and been humbled (Gen 32:25) defect.

Lion: Jesus- the Lion of the tribe of Judah (Ps 17:12) prowling enemy (1 Peter 5:8) fierce leader;

Lion's den: a very public and dangerous place of testing (Nah 2:11) surrounded; trapped.

Lips: unclean speech (Isa 6:5) with honey is seduction (Pro 5:3); word to be released.

Lipstick: decorative, rich lips and speech (1 Cor 1:5) covering of truth.

Liver: a filter for the body of Christ, namely discernment (Ps 119:125) internal organ.

Livestock: may mean dealing with livestock in the market, plenty (Ps 50:10); blessing.

Lock: a situation requiring a key of wisdom to gain entry (Matt 16:19, Neh 7:3) restriction; blocked.

Locker rooms: coaching or preparing for an event in one's life (Eph 6:15) storage place.

Locusts: devouring pestilence symbolizing a swarming evil army (Joel 2:25) swamp of attack.

Lottery: sudden financial gain (Pro 13:11, Heb 13:5) blessings (Phil 4:19) Game of chance.

Love: pure affection, the opposite of lust (1Cor 13); emotions.

Luggage: baggage from one's past (Matt 11:28) prepared to move on (Luke 10:4)

Lukewarm water: spiritual compromise, lethargy or passivity (Rev 3:15)

Lungs: life and breath and praise (Gen 2:7. Ps 150:6); internal organ.

Lust: lustful dreams are not from God, may reveal lust in your heart (1 John 2:16, Col 3:5)

Lying: a liar in a dream is a lying spirit notice if you lie in your dreams (Pro 26:28)

M

Maggot: defeat and death (Isa 14:11) Judgment.

Magic / magician: witchcraft, divination, deceiving spirits and fraud (Acts 13:10) seductive attraction.

Magnifying Glass: intent examination (2 Cor 13:5) Focus

Maid: servant- hood someone who cleans up others' messes in prayer see Janitor

Mailbox: prophetic ministry, where prophetic messages are delivered (Mark 6:11)

Mailman: a messenger or prophet (2 Kings 9:30) news bearer.

Makeup: covering one's flaws (2 Kings 9:30); hiding Truth.

Mail: may mean 'maladies' (since the root mal occurs in many illness) and may divulge that the dream is about your health (Matt 10:1)

Manager: humble beginnings the birth of Christ (Luke 2:7); basics

Manna: supernatural provision from the unknown source, 'what is it? (Exod 16:35); Angel food.

Mansion: a heavenly residence in eternity (Ps 49:14-15) New Home; executive life.

Mantle: authority, office, position, ranking (1King 19:19); clothing.

Manure: filth where placed or seen however promotes growth (Ezek 4:12) dung's hill.

Map: direction for one's life or a literal location (Ezek 5:2); overview; seeing above all

Marathon: see race; pressing to a finish line.

Marching: a coming army (Joel 2:7) in unison or unity (Josh 6:7); part of a Team.

Marriage: dreaming of marriage may mean working together. (3 John 1:8, Heb 13:4)

Mascara: anything to do with eyes suggests improving vision or creative perspective, see eyes; clearing vision.

Mask: disguise or deceit (2 Cor 11:14); undercover; untruthful.

Mattress: sleep and the need to rest more (Ps 127:2); place of comfort. To relax.

Measuring stick / tape: see ruler; plumb line;

Meat: spiritual nourishment for the mature, important spiritual truths (1 Cor 3:2)

Medal: reward, honor and recognition (Rev 22:12)

Medical Exam: the need for spiritual or emotional introspection (Mark 2:17, Jer 33:6); evaluation; check up; Time of review.

Medicine: God's remedy for a situation or problem (Jer 8:22); a solution; restoration will come quickly.

Melting: resignation and the loss of one's firm beliefs (Isa 13:7); Fading away; losing influence; hindrance will be removed.

Menorah: the nation of Israel or God's chosen people (Exod 25:31-40); lamp of God; Holy object; represents the church.

Menstruation: purification (2 Sam 11:4) may be literal message of timing (Gen 31:35) Leaking vessels; losing life; being weakened; drained.

Mental Hospital: internal conflict with overwhelming emotional confusion (Isa 26:3); Battle within the minds; wavering thoughts.

Menu: one's options or choices in life (Ps 25:12, Est 2:9); Valley of decision; choices to make. Life critical choice.

Meteor: the end of days or last day disasters (Matt 24:29, Rev 8:10); sign from Heaven;

Microphone / megaphone: can symbolize having a voice to influence many. (Ps 130:2); rising public speaker. Person with testimony.

Microscope: intense self – examination (Lam 3:40); examine the details; will be highlighted even if you are hidden in the eyes of many.

Midnight: a time to pray for others while they sleep, and to thank God (Ps 119:62); Changing of the day; dark time.

Mildew / Mold: a curse to be broken off (Amos 4:9); stain; internal defect; to be spotted.

Military Uniforms: a call to prepare for battle (Eph 6:11, 2 Tim 2:3-4) High standard; New job; Keeper of the gates or standard.

Milk: God's Word (1 Peter 2:2); Daily dose needed.

Millstone: being weighted down with either sin or grief (Heb 12:1); symbol of history, something important in your past. Type of Judgement.

Minefield: concealed dangers and obstacles (Job 28:10-13); approach with caution.

Mining: digging for God's wisdom and truths (Ecc 7:25); going deep; hard work; hidden treasure.

Mire: sinking in trails and appearing trapped by one's enemy (Ps 69:2); sticky traps.

Mirror: self - appraisal or evaluation (James 1:23); doorway; inverted pictures.

Miscarriage / abortion: a canceled or terminated goal or project (Isa 66:9)

Missiles: spiritual warfare bombardment (Eph 6:16); under attack; to take aim; going after a target.

Missionary: literal or symbolic of ministry travels or financial investment. (Acts 15:36); pioneer for a project.

Mockingbird: mockery or scorn from relationships (Luke 22:63). Deception within.

Moldy bread: a call to find fresh teaching (Josh 9:12, John 6:51). Defective meal, old diet; time of lack; stale.

Money: financial blessings and prosperity, see riches; business opportunity; financial crisis.

Monkey: oppressive spirit taking one captive- ‘monkey on his back’ (Hab 1:9); something hanging or swinging around.

Monk / Nun: hiding from others (Matt 5:15-16) pray without ceasing (1 Thess 5:17); religious leader; set aside for a dedicated purpose.

Monster: a demonic oppressor using intimidation to defeat (Isa 51:9, 2 Tim 1:7); False god. Desire to create fear and hurt.

Moon: night, but also the end of a journey or a season (Ps 104:19); change of cycle.

Mop: needing to clean one’s path and walk with God (Eph 4:1).

Mortgage: large debt (Rom 13:8) being a servant to another; New project.

Moth: a devourer of one’s possessions (Ps 39:11); unclean situation.

Motorcycle: small and efficient, fast – moving ministry (Acts 17:28a); driving dangerously; skilled driver.

Mountain: troubles to be overcome and cast away with faith and speech. (Matt 11:23) Opportunity to go after;

Mourning / mourners: spirits of grief, death (Matt 5:4); time of sorrow; unexpected disaster.

Mouse: unclean choices (Lev 11:29); worker in the night;

Mouth: a symbol of your words and speech and thus, your world, see tongue; opening.

Movie: used in dreams to show some thing literal, note titles, actors names (Col 1:26); rapid moving picture; increase in vision; getting the big picture.

Moving van / truck: transitioning in ministry or relocating literally in life. (Acts 17:28). Things will change quickly; able to carry load or burden for others.

Mud / dirt: can symbolize being stained by sin (Isa 57:20, Ps 1:18); original raw materials; Weaker part of man; Pliable mind set.

Muddy water: “muddying the water” to make things less clear or pure. (Pro 25:26) to mix God word with false teaching; polluted food

Mule: an unbridled, stubborn person (Ps 32:9-10); beast of burden.

Murder / murderer: an evil spirit seeking to destroy one’s life (John 10:10); a stealer of souls; intruder.

Muscles: spiritual strength (Matt 12:29); able to get the work done; able to support others.

Music notes: the flow of life living in harmony with others (Rom 12:16); worshippers; things in harmony or set in order.

Musical instruments: unity with diversity (Ps 98:6, 150, Eph 5:19); tool for excellence.

Mustard or mustard seed: represent small faith (Matt 13:31-32); small but powerful; easy to be lost.

Mute: presence of a deaf and dumb spirit cannot speak for self (Matt 9:33, Mark 9:17-29); Time of silence.

Muzzle: being forbidden to speak, guarding one’s mouth from sin (Ps 39:1); restriction;

N

Nagging: a harassing spirit, torment (Judg 16:16); constant poking by others.

Nail polish: preparing the hands for battle or a big job ahead, see fingers (Ps 144:1); hands ready to serve.

Naked: pure (Gen 2:25, Job 1:21) shame (Isa 47:3) vulnerable, uncovered (Gen 9:21)

Names: pray for those seen in dreams: research name meaning for a message to yourself; identity

Nearsighted: shortsighted, need to think futuristically, ‘see down the road’ (2 Peter 1:19)

Neck: that which supports the head of the one in authority (Pro 6:21); able to turn; an influencer.

Necklace: a yoke around the neck, a bondage (Ps 73:6, Isa 10:27); special gift that others will see; valuable treasure.

Needle (eye of): impossible odds when praying for the wealthy to be saved (Matt 19:24; sharp point to penetrate; to sew, repair and bring together; to mend other.

Neighbor: often a literal call to pray for them symbolically means God's family (Matt 19:19); group support.

Nest: one's home (Pro 27:8, Job 29:18); place of comfort; place of origin.

Nets: tools for winning the lost (Luke 5:2-4) a trap laid by spiritual enemies (Ps 141:10); network or teamwork.

New year: a new beginning, a fresh start (2 Cor 5:17, Exod 40:2); Passing for the old;

Newspaper: spreading the word about something to many (Isa 33:13); reporting;

Nightclub: foolish or sinful conduct (Ecc 7:4) see bar; house of sins

Noon: noonday brightness represents God's blessings and healing (Job 11:17, Isa 58:10) Heat of the day;

Noose: impending judgment, death by hanging (Job 18:10, Est 7:10); trap going after the neck.

Nose: may represent scent, or abstractly, discernment, if bloody strife (Pro 30:33); breathing.

Nudity: see naked; uncovered; bare; ashamed, being real.

Numbness: desensitized by life (Ps 38:8) see paralyzed; loss of sensitivity

Nurse: an aid who brings you health in Christ (Num 11:12) see doctor; willing to serve and care.

Nursing / breastfeed: a call to breastfeed (Isa 66:11, 1 Thess 2:7) feed a desire (Ps 37:4) helping the simple and lowly.

Nuts and bolts: taking care of the details (Luke 10:41, 1 Chro28:19) small thing that whole others together.

O

Oak: great strength (Amos 2:9, Ps 29:9) Tree, One that cover or shelter others.

Oar: without one a boat, it remains no progress (Acts 17:28, Ekek 27:29, Hab 3:10)

Oasis: a place of refreshment in a desert season of life, see desert (Exod 15:23); outpouring of water.

Obesity: struggling with great, well – fed freshly desires (Gal 5:16)

Ocean: God’s deep truths / Judgments (Ps 36:6) if tossed at sea, immature; (Eph 4:14) abundant supply.

Occult: may mean literal curses or spells being cast at you, pray protection (Pro 26:2)

Office: may symbolize co – workers or administrative details of a project (2 Tim 2:15); headquarter; place of planning; base of operations.

Oil: invites anointing (Exod 29:7) Holy Spirit (1 Sam 16:13) used for healing (James 5:14)

Oil (Crude): abundant finances and gushing provision (Phil 4:19); fuel for future.

Ointment: soothing, healing balm (Jer 8:22); restoration.

Old friends: returning to history; remembering your origin; fixing relationship.

Old homes: usually a time line drawing attention to a healing season. (1Chron 17:27); History of your legacy.

Old pets: usually a time line pointing to emotions you had while with a pet. (Pro 12:10)

Olive / olive oil: the oil of peace is coming, used in peace offerings (Lev 7:12) New anointing; Purity.

Olive branch: global symbol of peace grafted in Gentile Christians (Rom 11:17); reaching out.

Olympics: competition, needing endurance and stamina (1Cor 9:24, 1 Tim 6:12). Ancient Rome and the time of persecution.

Onions: crying or tears (Rev 21:4). Seasoning.

Orchestra / symphony: see musical instruments; group in harmony.

Orgy: dark sexual deviancy (1 Cor 6:9, 1 Peter 4:3, Gal 5:21) Sin within the body.

Orphan: emotionally or spiritually abandoned (Ps 10:14, James 1:27) Outside of Family; rough past, difficult life.

Ostrich: poor common sense and heartlessness (Lam 4:3)

Ouija boards: playing around with demonic entities (Lev 19:31) satanic doorways.

Oven: incubating new ideas or goals that require time (Ps 27:14), cooking, trials,

Owl: demonic spirits disguised as spirit guides, abomination (Lev 11:13-18). Night sight; wisdom that others don't see.

Ox: strength increase (Pro 14:4) Beast of burden, worker, Can bear burden.

Oyster: a producer and home to hidden, sacred treasure (Matt 7:6) Maker of precious things.

P

Paddling: discipline, see spanking, effort in a direction. Darning to do something new

Pain: literal or emotional to your body or the body of Jesus (Rev 21:4); discomfort; give attention to an urgent need.

Paint: covering something up or a fresh coat that covers old stains (Jer 22:14); re do with a new perspective.

Painting: see paint; unique skilled;

Pale horse: death (Rev 6:8) greenish; faded; aggressive attack.

Pallbearer: friend carrying you through seasons of death and hardship (Ecc 12:5)

Palm: when opened to you, an invitation and promise for care (Isa 49:16); secure place.

Palm reading: sorcery and divination (Lev 20:6) doorway to deception; lies.

Palm tree: flourishing, righteousness (Ps 92:12); survivor in dry place. Someone that stand out.

Panther: approaching evil (Pro 26:13, pro 29:25);

Pants: if without, symbolizes vulnerability, Lower garment; Loin girded.

Paparazzi: coming fame, may reveal idolatry, fame, respect of persons (Acts 10:34)

Parachute: safety and rescue during crisis (Ps 144:7); flying & Rising above,

Parade: victory and success (Est 6:9, 2 Cor 2:14), display before many; victory march.

Paralyzed: the enemy is trying to cripple you (John 5:8); restriction; hindrance.

Paramedic: an aid during a time of medical emergency, healing being near (Ps 147:3)

Parent: authority (Deut 5:16) earthly father may = heavenly father (Heb 12:10-11)

Park: a place to relax and enjoy creation (Ecc 2:5, Gen 24:63); Family time.

Parrot: a gossip, anyone who repeats what he or she hears (Pro 17:9); friendly to animals.

Party: a celebration (Luke 15:24) if a wild or drunken party, ungodly (Gal 5:21)

Passenger (in a moving vehicle): partners in ministry or in a move of God, see cars

Passport: international travel (Exod 13:21); Authorized to go.

Pastries: may represent gossip (Pro 18:8) light meals, weak.

Pasture: peaceful life (Ps 95:7,Ps 23) time of restoration.

Path: one's journey through life, if travel represents walking in God's ways. (Ps 27:11)

Pawnshop: the path of poverty (Ps 109:11); exchange, trading.

Paycheck: the wages of one's lifestyle (Rom 6:23) financial reward (Matt 10:10)

Peace: Proof of a God – centered thought life (Isa 26:3)

Peacock: pride or showiness (1 Kings 10:22); one that stand out, a display to others.

Pearl: the Gospel of Christ (Matt 7:6) something valuable (Matt 13:45) gate to glory

Pen / pencil: the writing gift and the ability to communicate (Ps 45:1) teaching time

Penny: perhaps a symbol of poverty (Matt 12:42) the beginning to financial wealth.

Pentagram: satanic worship or occult practices (Mic 5:12). Danger to soul.

Perfume: gladness of heart (Pro 27:9) aroma of Christ (2 Cor 2:14-15, Eph 5:2)

Peroxide: healing of wounds, emotional, spiritual or physical (Job 5:18)

Pestilence: God's judgment on wickedness (Ps 91:6, Hab 3:5) devouring agent.

Pharaoh: pride and hard - heartedness in authority (Exod 8:19); ruler, to be in charge.

Photographer: one who makes memories for others (1 Thess 3:6). Snapshot of life.

Pig: unclean living (2Pet 2:22, Matt 7:6); devouring trash.

Pig Snout: if with a gold ring represents a woman without discretion (Pro 11:22)

Pigeon: was an offering for sin in the Old Testament, a call to repentance. (Lev 1:14)

Piggy Bank: financial savings, bits at a time, faithful stewardship (Luke 12:42)

Pimple / acne: a situation that needs to come to a head to find healing (Pro 4:22)

Pioneers: leadership, trailblazers, the opposite of a settler (Num 33:1)

Pirate: a thieving spirit sent to steal your finances (John 10:10), unruly

Pit bull: fierceness and savagery in conversation (Pro 26:17) Watchdog

Plague: God's judgment upon wickedness (Ps 106:29). Long trial.

Planting: sowing and reaping (Ps 107:37-38, Mark 4) see farm. To take care of.

Plants / Vines: family and children (Ps 128:3)

Plate / platter: schedule – 'a lot on my plate' especially servant - hood (Luke 10:40)

Platoon: a united group of praying believers in spiritual warfare (Rev 19:19)

Playground: a place for child's play, a call to maturity (1 Cor 13:11) family time; place of enjoyment.

Plow: faithful, hard Christian work (1 Cor 9:10); farming, crop growing; preparing for harvest.

Plumb line: lining up with the truth (Amos 7:8); standard; benchmark; gauge rod.

Plumbing (pipes): flow in production, if crooked, obstruction (Isa 40:4, Luke 3:5) relationship through connections.

Poison: lying wicked words (Ps 140:3); secret killer; death approaching.

Police / Cop: spiritual authority (1 Pet 2:13) Line of defense; implementing law.

Polishing: paying attention to excellence in one's work (Ezek 21:11, Phil 4:8); removing rough edges.

Pollution: a nation's wickedness (Ps 106:38); contamination; mixing; blending; dangerous combination.

Polygraph Machine: see lie detector test; under examination

Pomegranates: God's sweetness (Song 4:3, Exod 28:34) 613 Jewish laws; fruit with crown; messiah star. Health recovery.

Pond: a small place where people gather together, work, club, school (Joel 2:16) water collection not flowing.

Porcupine: a prickly, worrisome situation (Isa 14:23, Matt 6:34); thorns; fruitless times.

Pork: see pig; unhealthy meat.

Porn: spirit of perversion confronting you or that you have confronted in someone else (Ps 101:3)

Pot hole: being stuck or hitting a rocky path in your journey (Pro 10:9) unexpected danger.

Potter's wheel / pottery: being molded or fashioned by God (Jer 18:6) Clay type of the flesh. Life is about to take a spin for a major redo and change.

Prayer: while asleep or while waking, proves our spirit never sleeps (1 Thess 5:17)

Connection to GOD.

Preacher / clergy: Jesus, Great Pastor / Shepherd (Heb 13:20) literal Pastor; Leader; man of influence. Visionary.

Pregnancy: conceiving an idea, waiting through its gestation and delivery (Isa 66:9)

Pressure cooker: the pressure cooker of life and stress (Job 33:7). Make the hard things softer; added heat.

Prince: could be a demonic principality (Dan 10:13) or Satan (Eph 2:2); Person of respect and Majesty. Well known; role model to many.

Principal: a demonic principality or territorial spirit over a region or group- see prince

Prison / Dungeon: bondages / restrictions (Isa 42:7); hindrance

Prophet: God's voice to you, pay attention to precisely what is said! (Deut 18:19)
Spokesman; influencer

Prostitute: see harlot; seducer; rise in sex sins.

Pruning: a season of God removing things from you to promote growth (John 15:2)

Psychics (Mediums): an evil spirit trying to counsel you in a dream. (1 Sam 28:3-24)

Pulpit: a call to preach or teach (Neh 8:4-6); rise to a place of influence.

Puppet / Marionette: a person controlled by a spirit (1 Kings 22:22-23); public show that is a front or a fake.

Purple: the color of royalty with humility (John 19:2) sign of wealth and luxury.

Purse: wealth or finances (Pro 7:20)time of increase.

Python: large, crushing, evil spirit – like depression, anxiety (Isa 59:4-5) dangerous enemy.

Q

Q – Tip: the need to clean out one's ears and listen to wisdom (Isa 6:10) pay attention.

Quadruplets: double portion - a double double! (2 Kings 2:9, Job 42:10)Four corners; four winds, universal impact.

Quail: God's creative provision in the desert (Ps 105:40) Birds that cannot handle the heat.

Quarterback: leadership under pressure, great responsibility (Neh 9:38); put on the frontline.

Quarters: represents $\frac{1}{4}$ of something eg. Of a year or sum of money (Job 31:6); Place of temporary abode.

Queen: may mean “the Queen of Heaven,” an evil focus of worship / idolatry (Jer 7:18); woman leader, age woman; lady of influence.

Queen bee: a highly productive person or woman (Pro 31). Center of attraction.

Question marks: the question in your life (Matt 22:46); place of decision making.

Quiver: the womb, with children as arrows (Ps 127:3-5); case for arrow that is filled is ready for war or hunting.

Quiz: see test; short examination; unexpected assessment.

R

Race: endurance, running the race of life (1 Cor 9:24); competition; pressing towards a mark or target.

Radio: communication in the airwaves and prayer (1 Cor 14:5-9, Eph 2:2); power in your voice.

Raft: safety on the trouble seas of life (Ps 65:7). A way of escape when there is danger.

Rags: poverty or dead works (Isa 64:6); unless efforts. Working in vain.

Rain: if soft, flourishing prosperity (Ps 72:6) if hard the storms of life (Matt 7:25) Former Rain is for all of humanity. Latter rain for God people.

Rainbow: promises God has made to you (Gen 9:13); Covenant with God.

Ram: God’s provision when time of testing has passed (Gen 22:13); redemption. Fighter.

Rape: implies taking something without consent, taken by force (John 10:10, Gen 34:27)

Rapist: an out of control set of circumstances (Ps 46:2-4, Isa 43:2); lustful person.

Rapture: Christ's second coming, a call to salvation or prayer for the lost (1 Thess 4:17)

Rat: see mouse; unclean creature. Night beast.

Raw meat: laziness (Pro 12:27)

Razor: lies and destruction (Ps 52:2); sharp leader; deep cut; precision in decision.

Rearview mirror: focusing on the past, not moving forward (Phil 3:13, Luke 9:62); to review the past.

Red: modern meanings in context – love, passion, courage, heat, spiritual blood (1 John 5:6);

Red Cross: salvation and Christ's sacrifice of His life (1 John 5:6); helping agency.

Red eyes: red – eyed entities in dreams / visions are demonic, can symbolize drinking alcohol (Pro 23:29); wrath and fierce anger.

Red horse: war (Rev 6:4)

Red tape: a tedious process in achieving a goal (Phil 4:13); artificial hindrance due to the rules of men.

Referee: a mediator or advocate, possibly Christ or the literal person shown (John 15:26)

Reflection: seeing self in water or mirror represents seeing into the heart (Pro 27:19); valuing the past.

Relatives: see family; close relationship and long lasting connections.

Relay race: teamwork (Eph 4:16); common goal.

Remote control: control over your life or another's (1 Thess 4:4); able to make quick changes.

Reptile: a demonic spirit see snake; slippery; low lifestyle.

Restaurant: where spiritual food is prepared, eg church (1 Cor 10:3); elegant lifestyle.

Resurrection: life where there was death, physically, spiritual and emotional. (John 11:25)

Resuscitate: see resurrection; opportunity for a new start.

Reunion: unity, a gathering for memories (Jer 3:18); time of old friends.

Rhinestones: artificiality, phoniness, insincerity or deceit (2 Cor 13:8)

Rib: woman from and by man's side (Gen 2:22); relationship focus.

Ribbons: praise, worship and celebration (Ps 20:5); things set in order.

Riches: God's financial security (Phil 4:19); material blessing.

Right turn: a turn toward wisdom (Ecc 10:2); moving to a place of authority.

Ring: favor, authority and affirmation (Jer 22:24, Hag 2:23); Sign of covenant or marriage.
The eternal circle.

River: refreshing (Ps 105:41) peace like a river (Isa 48:18) clean, living water (John 7:38);
flow of blessing.

Roads: direction for one's life path, see journey / trip; pathway.

Roadblock: in one's way on life's journey (Lam 3:9, Isa 40:4); hindrance.

Road signs: follow the sign's message: slow; stop, yield, watch for children. (Jer 31:21);
direction as we travel.

Rode: modern – relaxation, scriptural – wealth and authority (Isa 22:21)

Rock: Christ, the rock of ages (1 Cor 10:4) solid foundation; unmovable based.

Roller coaster: trilling fun, see amusement park / fair; instability; unpredictable

Roof: covering your household, protection in life's storms (Ps 5:11); protection from above.

Rooster: a wake – up call (mark 13:35) denial of Jesus (Matt 14:72) denial of Jesus (Matt 14:72)

Roots: the history of a thing or people (Ps 80:9, Ps 1:3); Depth of personal strength.

Rope: bound in sin (Pro 5:22) triple braid symbolizes power in unity (Ecc 4:12); tool to save another.

Roses: healing Jesus, the Rose of Sharon (song 2:1); beauty, improvement in your love life.

Rotting fruit: a sign of bad choices in life (Luke 6:43); souls about to be lost.

Rowing: hard manual labor under oppression (Mark 6:48); effort in a direction.

Rubies: a great value (Isa 54:12) Things that will last a long time.

Ruler / Tape measure: trying to measure up (1 Sam 16:7); gauging progress.

Running: the race of life and your journey (Phil 2:16); pushing yourself.

Rust: old, tarnished or needing practice, earthly riches (Matt 6:19); losing value

S

Sackcloth: fasting, repentance and prayer (Ps 35:13); humility; bring yourself low.

Safe: a place of safety, being safe (Pro 18:10) protected.

Salmon: having to swim upstream, go against the flow (Phil 4:13)

Salt: “salt of the earth”(Matt 5:13) graceful speech (Col 4:6) healing water. (2 Kings 2:21)

Sandals: see shoe, Basic footwear to guard your life journey.

Sandstorm: a desert storm symbolizing great trial (Ps 83:13-15). Rapid change in the atmosphere.

Satan: rebuke him using Jesus’ name if he is seen or heard in a dream. (Acts 26:18, Luke 10:17-19); rising enemy.

Saw: God’s power to cut or tear down (Isa 10:43); to divide

Scabs: indication that an emotional wound is healing but is not to be picked at (Ps 147:3)

Scars: past emotional wounds, hurts (John 20:27); rough history.

Scarecrow: fear, putting one’s faith in the wrong strength (Jer 10:5, Ps 28:8)

School: learning, grade level shows difficulty of test (Matt 11:29, Acts 19:9); willing to learn and develop; training center.

Scissors: cutting or pruning (Isa 18:5); garment business; to divide.

Scorpion: mix of a snake and a spider, both of which represents demons. (Luke 10:19); deadly attack.

Scroll: a written command and a commission from God (Ezek 3:1); book; written record.

Séance: could mean someone with occult ties is trying to influence your life. (Isa 54:17)

Seat belt: protection, especially in ministry (Ps 5:11) see car; design to hold you unto your seat / place of authority.

Secretary: a helper, assistants in dreams may be angels (Dan 10:13, Rom 16:22)

Security Guards: possibly an angel, a protector in authority (1 Chor 9:27); defense.

Seed: an investment to be tended (Mark 4:31-32)' plans for new opportunity.

Sewer: a dirty environment (James 1:21); waste, dump.

Sex: Healthy marriage (Prov 5:19); Intimacy; Pleasurable moments.

Shade: a reprieve from hard work, protection (Ps 121:5)

Shadow: covered by God (Ps 91:36:7) if dark, may be demonic / death. (Ps 44:19, 23:4)

Shaking hands: two people shaking hands symbolizes agreement (Job 17:3)

Shampoo / conditioner: a need for cleansing and conditioning / softening (Ps 51:2)

Shark: a hidden demonic predator, pray prayers of protection if seen in dream. (Isa 27:1)

Sheep: Christians, children of the Great Shepherd (John 10:15, 27); gentleness; short in vision.

Sheepdog: evangelistic, rounding up the sheep (John 10:16); overseer

Shelter: a place of protection from the elements of life (Ps 61:4); covering, to allow yourself to be submitted to.

Shepherd: Jesus, or a literal pastor to pray for (Ps 23:1). Caretaker.

Sheriff: an encounter of the law, possibly a pastor or teacher (Gal 3:21, Matt 5:17)

Shield: one's faith that extinguishes the enemy's arrows (Eph 6:16); confidence.

Ships: a group or organization with may on board (Acts 27:37); journey.

Shipwreck: the destruction or sinking of a ship (group) or one's own faith. (1 Tim 1:19)

Shirt: one's personal covering, if giving shirt off one back, sacrifice (Matt 5:40); first impressions.

Shoe: the gospel of peace, walking in peace (Eph 6:11); land to Claim; Check your walk before men.

Shopping: choices and selection to be made (Deut 30:19); need to buy or invest.

Shopping cart: what is in the cart is what to focus on, food = spiritual food, etc (John 6:27)

Shoulders: shouldering a burden (Gen 49:15) also government (Isa 9:6); able to bear other.

Showers: see rain; harvest time is coming.

Sickle: for harvesting, symbolically for souls or evangelism (Joel 3:13, Mark 4:29)

Silver: knowledge, insight, understanding (Pro 2:3-4) testing, refining (Mal 3:3); redemption; Medes and Persian or events dealing with Iran.

Sinking: disaster or emotional despair (Jer 51:64, Ps 69:15); about to be lost; urgent help needed.

Sinking ship: failure of a large work (1 Tim 1:19) see shipwreck, Business or Job in danger.

Sirens: a warning that battle is coming. A call to pray and trust victory (Num 10:9); Urgent.

Sister: if not literal a dear friend (Matt 12:50); able to bear with others.

Skiipping: being carefree (Job 21:11); able to escape tactics.

Skull / crossbones: death, opposing Christ's message (Luke 23:33, Pro 8:36).

Skydiving: freedom with risk (Gal 5:13), to glide above other.

Sled: expedient prayers during wartime (Job 38:22-23) see snow; travel will be easy.

Sleep / fatigue: a need for spiritual awakening (Pro 6:9, Eph 5:14); time for dream and visions to be birthed.

Sleeping bag: travel or emotional / spiritual homelessness (Jer 10:17); temporary state

Smoking: addictive behavior (Gal 5:1); warning to danger.

Snake: Satan (Gen 3:14) alcohol wine (Pro 23:32) evildoers (Ps 140:3); beguiling tactics

Snow: a call to war / pray seen in a dream or awake, snow heralds war (Job 38:22-23)

Soap: spiritual cleansing (Isa 1:25); time of washing old things away

Soldiers: part of God's army (2 Tim 2:3, 1 Cor 9:7) used by Satan (Mark 6:27); ready and able; already trained and armed.

Spanking: discipline or punishment (pro 13:24); effort to change to bend a person will power.

Sparrow: the Father's watchful care (Matt 10:29);

Spear: may represent a weapon / strategy God is going to give you for a problem (Ps 35:3). To reach and hit a target that is a far off.

Spider: sin, deception, false doctrine, temptation (Job 8:14, Isa 59:5); to entangled a victim.

Spit: utter contempt (Job 17:6); to despised. Show hate.

Spoon: ability to feed self or other spiritually (Matt 25:37) if baby spoon, see babies

Spring: new beginnings and new life (Zach 10:1); place of refreshing.

Staff: pastoral ministry, the tools of a shepherd (Ps 23:4); Team that is working to a common goal.

Stairs / steps: stages that take you to a higher place in life or in prayer (Job 14:16); connection to a higher level.

Stars: children (Neh 9:23, Gen 37:9-10); Jewish nation (Rev 12); Fire in the distance.

Statue of Liberty: the USA; the Holy Spirit's liberty (2 Cor 3:17); Link to Egypt.

Steak: spiritual food for the mature (Heb 5:12); meal prepared.

Steering wheel: direction for the road of life (Ps 32:8); power in your hands. New Vehicle.

Stillborn: a long – awaited dream symbolically carried to term, and it dies. (Isa 66:9)

Sting: see bees; puncher, to be injured; under unexpected attack.

Stop sign: to literally stop, as in behavior, activity etc see road signs; Change direction quickly.

Stork: a pregnancy, new baby, new experiences (Jer 8:7, John 3:3); Able to see.

Storms: see rain; Rapid change in atmosphere; approaching disaster.

Stove: projects in one's life i.e 'it's on the back burner' see oven; Controlled heat.

Straitjacket: mental imprisonment (Isa 26:3. 2 Cor 3:11); able to achieve a targeted goal

Strangers: spirits, bad or good – watch their defining behaviors (Heb 5:14); unexpected visitor; unknown person.

Strangulation: trying to choke out one's faith (Ps 140:4); vines sapping your strength; attack around your neck.

Straw: lesser works that will be burned up on day (1 Cor 3:12-13); weak material. Food for those at the lowest.

Street names: study all street name meanings and relevance to you, see names;

Strongman: a strong demonic spirit requiring binding in prayer (Mark 3:27); head of the team; pillar and foundation of a cause.

Student: see school; willing to learn; need of mentoring.

Submarine: submission to authority, coming under (Rom 13:1); attack from below.

Sugar: sweetness of life, too much means imbalanced spiritual diet (Rom 14:17)

Suicide: ruining one's own reputation by foolishness (Ecc 7:17); depression & death.

Suitcase / bag: baggage from one's past (Matt 11:28) prepared to move on (Luke 10:4); ready for work. Ready to move.

Summer: a season of making plans and working hard (Pro 6:8); best times are coming.

Sun: the son, Jesus (Mal 4:2); Light for all; gauge for the day.

Sunburn: great time spent with the Son, Jesus (Matt 17:2); trial is difficult to handle.

Sunrise: the beginning of a thing, a life or season (Ecc 1:5); Joy in the morning.

Sunset: the end of a thing, a life or a season (Ps 113:3); Night is rapidly coming.

Superheroes: supernatural abilities for spiritual warfare (2 Cor 10:4-5); something extra or gifted.

Surfboard: riding a coming wave of success (Ps 118:25, 51:15); time it arise.

Surgery: the great physical repairing emotions with his skilled hand (Luke 5:31)

Surgical instruments: show which surgery e,g 'open heart surgery' see surgery

Surrounded: being slandered by others (Ps 109:3); group support.

Swearing / cussing: an unclean spirit: (Eph 5:4); to take an oath

Sweeping: see broom; Time of cleansing; to make ready for an event.

Swimming: leisure, possibly trying to stay afloat, see drowning; able to ride the waves.

Sword: harsh words (Ps 57:4) the sword of the spirit, God's Word (Eph 6:17); warrior; soldier; ready for battle.

T

Tablet: the heart ready to be inscribed upon (Pro 7:3); Written Word; Moses Law.

Tailor: perhaps an angel or the Holy Spirit preparing you for a life event (Like 22:9)

Tambourine: praise and celebration (Ps 81:2, Jer 31:4); music with the hands;

Tape measure: see measuring tape/ stick; gauge rod; standard.

Target: aiming for a goal, good of bad (Lam 3:12); having a set goal.

Tarot cards: demonic, fortune telling (Acts 16:16); satanic doorway

Teacher: a pastor, teacher or Jesus Himself (Luke 6:40); hero from your children; to cause to understand.

Tears: see crying; time of sorrow and pain; over joyed.

Teeth: needed for a mature spiritual diet (Heb 5:14); Place of power; fearful sight.

Teeth falling out: losing one's ability to consume a healthy spiritual diet. (Heb 5:12)

Telephone: communication – with others, but mainly with God (Jer 33:3). To make a connection

Telescope: the prophetic gift and looking into the future (1 Cor 13:2); foresight into the days ahead.

Television: media arts may mean distraction (Pro 6:6-11, Ps 101:3); ability to both see and hear.

Tennis: who begins the game? This is the one who is serving (Matt 23:11)

Tent: our temporary, earthly body (2 Cor 5:1-6) see camp / campgrounds; short stay.

Termites: small spiritual attacks eating away at your faith's foundation (Ps 11:3); internal attack.

Test: being tested by life's trails (2 Cor 8:22) a lesson to learn (Ps 119:71) examination.

Text message: receiving words eg, prophetic words (Ecc 12:10, 2 Cor 2:13); brief warning.

Theatre: living in the stage of life with other watching (Matt 5:16); model before many.

Thermometer / fever: spiritual infection in the Church Body. or in yours. see fever

Thief: Satan, or one of his spirits sent to steal from you (John 10:10, Prov 29:24); to break in;

Thigh: a covenant between two people in biblical times (Gen 24:9) place of strength.

Thirst: spiritual thirst for Living water, Jesus (Matt 5:6, John 4:14); dryness

Thorns: trails (2 Cor 12) life's cares choking our faith (Matt 4:18-19); evidence of Sin

Throne: the seat of God's authority (Isa 66:1, Rev 7:10), Decision making station

Thunder: like God's voice (Job 40:9, 1 Sam 2:10) God's anger (Job 36:33); sudden loud noise

Tick: life itself is in the blood (Lev 17:11) so a tick denotes something draining it. Blood suckers.

Ticket: a coming journey or entrance into a new place in life (Exod 33:10). Permit to enter.

Tidal: may represent a sudden, surprise attack (Prov 22:5); High rising army.

Tidal wave: overwhelming conflict (2 Sam 22:5) see hurricane, floods

Tiger: may represent a sudden surprise attack (Pro 29:25); to pounce upon.

Tightrope: having to watch one's step to avoid danger (Ps 119:133). Little room for error

Tin: the worthless dross and debris of one's life (Isa 1:25)

Tires: where the rubber meets the road, if flat shows inconvenience (Acts 17:28); wheels, things are about to get moving.

Toilet: the most vulnerable and susceptible of all positions we can be in when it is in use (Job 36:7); dumping ground.

Tongue: decides your future holds the power in life and death (Pro 18:21, James 3:4-5); rudder of life.

Toothpaste: the need to clean one's mouth, speech, attitude (Matt 14:11)

Tornado: a warning of coming danger or attack and a call to pray (Ps 55:8); Rapid judgment

Towel: service and humility (John 13:4);

Track: a race you are in (1 Cor 9:25) see running; layout set for you.

Tractor: brings greater and faster return for your spiritual sowing, see cars and farm

Traffic light: life direction- red stop / yellow caution / green, go see road signs

Train: speed and connection, The Robe of God (Isa 6), Long but connecting too many.

Trap: could indicate a coming, hidden snare in life (Pro 29:25)

Treasure chest: hidden prizes awards and spiritual jewels (Matt 13:52); things of great value on it way.

Trees: nations (Ezek 31:14) people (Dan 4:20-22, Matt 13:31-32). In Ps 1 it is to show how healthy and connected is a person to its source.

Triplets: a coming triple blessing or a triple alliance of friends (Ecc 4:12); 3 in 1 concept; 3D system, Three fold cords.

Troops: see army, soldiers (Mic 5:1); ready for battle.

Trophy: may represent a coming award or convey God's recognition (Rom 2:6, 2 Tim 4:8)

Truck: ministry or a corporate move of God, varying by size of truck, see car; bigger movements.

Trumpet: celebration or praise (Ps 98:6) a call to war (Amos 3:6); Time of celebration of the new moon.

Tug- of- War: a competition pray for peace with person shown (Eph 6:12); Time of pull and tug from within your team.

Tulips: speech and your 'two lips' see mouth, tongue; Special plants.

Tumor: may be a literal call to prayer, removal of a bad personal growth. (Eph 4:16)

Turban: righteousness (Job 29:14) Being at the head.

Turtle: slow, withdrawn, spirit of stupor, cautious, protected, safe, steady (James 1:19)

Twins: the double- portion anointing on your life 9 2 Kings 2:9, Job 42:10). Matching pair.

Two cents: a worthless opinion small acts of obedience seen by God (Mark 12:42, Luke 12:6). Guidance and counsel from the simple.

U

Umbilical cord: a connection to life and spiritual nourishment (Col 2:19). Mother's link.

Umbrella: personal covering or protection in life's storms (Ps 27:5); To allow others to take lead of you.

Umpire: advocate, moderator and referee, maybe a leader or good friend. (Job 16:19)

Uniform: conformity or unity (2 Sam 20:8), dress for a team.

Universe: God's eternal creativity (Heb 11:3, Eph 4:10); Bigness; high above.

Upstairs: the 2nd Heaven where we do spiritual warfare prayer, see building levels

V

Vacation: refreshment and rest (Heb 4:10); Time to come apart; place to travel.

Vacuum: while in use, shows the need to remove dirt from object or person shown (Lev 22:5);

Vampires: someone who sucks the life out of you (Lev 17:11) see tick; night creature.

Vault: see safe; hidden treasure; difficult to open.

Vegetables: a healthy spiritual diet, see food; farming food.

Veil: something that is being hidden (Ps 139:15); virgin of dignity.

Vein: contains the blood, or the life (Lev 17:11) see vampire

Vertigo: being out of balance or off balance (2 Cor 8:13)

Village: a community or group of people close to you (Eph 2:19, Luke 9:56)

Vine: Jesus is the vine, we are the branches and in Him we bear fruit (John 15:5); wild vine can represent killing other by choking them.

Vineyard: the world is God's – the vinedresser's – vineyard (Isa:1, Matt 21:28); Harvest time

Vitamins: a supplement to your spiritual diet, i.e teaching (3 John 2) healthy

Voices: God's voice always brings peace, Satan's will bring fear or confusion (John 10:27); time to pay attention.

Vomit: ridding yourself of upsetting things, also compare to foolishness. (2 Peter 2:22) returning to former life and gods.

Voodoo doll: a symbol of witchcraft and cures being spoken over you (Pray Pro 26:2)

Vultures: unclean, impure and ravaged (Prov 30:17); Eagles of the Sky.

W

Wading: experimenting, testing the waters (Ezek 47:4)

Wagons: used by pioneers in trailblazing a pioneering spirit (Ps 65:11); lots of items to move.

Waiter: someone who serves spiritual food, may be a deacon (Acts 6:2-6); servant's ministry.

Waking: a need for spiritual awakening (Rom 13:11); alertness.

Wallet: wealth or finances (Prov 7:20) need to money

War: see battle; Time to be aggressive and advance.

Warehouse: a symbolic place where God stores up and then distributes to us. (Job 38: 22-23)

Warlock: see psychics, witch; male oppressor.

Washing: if clothes, represents holiness or cleansing from sin (Ps 51:7) see bathing

Washing machine: where deep cleansing occurs in one's life (Isa 1:18)

Wasps: see bees; Under attack.

Watch: God's timing for you individually (2 Peter 3:9); block of time that is set for a job to be done.

Watchdog: symbolizes God's guardianship for you or the person in the dream (Exod 28:14)

Water: precedes birth, brings cleansing, implies baptism (Ezek 16:4, John 3:5, Num 19:21)

Waterfall: overwhelming refreshments after a long climb (Ps 42:7, Rev 14:2)

Waves: grief (2 Sam 22:5) or billows of blessings and love (Ps 42:7-8); unstable seas.

Weaving: the many lesson/experiences woven in the tapestry of your life (Ps 139:15)

Wedding/wedding cake: undying, sweet love (song 7:12, Ps 100:5); time to give away; celebration time.

Weeds: sins and hindrances to your spiritual sowing and reaping, see gardening

Well: generational blessing and legacy (Gen 26:17-35, John 4:12); nature flow

Whale: chastisement that turns out to be our salvation (Jonah 1:7); Something big is coming.

Wheat: the godly, Christians (Matt 13:24-30); Flour for bread or staff of life.

Wheelchair: a handicapped position in a situation (Acts 3:6)

Wheels: see tires; many things will roll by.

Whirlwind: sudden calamity (Prov 1:27 God's mode of operation (Job 38:1, 2 Kings 1:11)

Whispering: secrecy (Ezek 33:30, Isa 45:19) gossip (Lam 3:62); secret message.

White: Christ's glory (Mark 9:3, Rev 20:11) Purity (Rev 3:4, 19:8)

White horse: the return of Christ (Rev 19.) Can also mean antichrist (Rev 19.)

Wilderness: see desert; Place of dryness.

Wig: a cover-up an untruth (John 16:13); Not real.

Wind: change, God's messenger of change, ' the winds of change' (Ps 104:4, Eph 4:14) The power of the Holy Spirit.

Window: may be God revealing a 'window of opportunity' (Gen 8:6, 2 Cor 11:33); Illumination; ability to see.

Wine: likened to a snakebite or viper's poison (Prov 23:32-33)

Wings: the protection of angels (Ps 91); will be flying soon.

Winter: dormancy or the last part of someone's life (Ps 74:17, song 2:11); Coldness. Limited and weather and environment.

Witch: witchcraft, an evil spirit attempting to frighten/curse you (1 Chron 10:13, Pro 26:2)

Withering: no longer thriving, seeing one's circumstances diminish (Ezek 17:10, Prov 11:10); losing influence.

Wizard: see psychics; devilish leader.

Wolves: spirits (through people) that come to attack God's flock (Acts 20:29, Matt 10:16)

Woods: see trees; lost in the forest;

Workshop: God's process of building your life (Heb 11:10); Training by modelling

Wound: an area of emotional hurt (Jer 8:22); weaken.

Wreath: may be a holiday timeline clue, on the head it symbolizes wisdom (Prov 4:7-9)

Wrestling: wrestling with a stranger means struggling against an evil spirit (Eph 6:12)

Writing: pay attention to message whether on a wall or on paper (Dan 5:5)

X

Xeron machine: repetition or endless cycles of a situation (Job 33:29)

X – ray: having intense perception and spiritual discernment (Ps 119:125) reviewing structure and thing that hold it as one.

Y

Yawning: see waking, sleep/ fatigue; weariness.

Yeast: religious behaviors that puff you up e.g hypocrisy (Matt 16:6)

Yelling: irritating annoying situation of people (Prov 27:14); loud speaker

Yellow: cowardliness (Josh 1:7)

Yield: a call to submission, see road signs; willing to adapt; able to bend under pressure.

Yin – yang: someone influenced by incorrect Asian philosophy (Ps 119:3)

Yoga: influences of Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism or Sikhism (Ezek 11:12)

Yoke: a picture of slavery, see necklace; following a leader willingly.

Yo- yo: indecisiveness (Ps 20:8)

Z

Zebra: a black or white situation that calls for an unequivocal decision (1 Kings 3:9)

Zipper on lips: see buttons on mouth, a sign that you are to keep quite (Lam 3:28)

Zodiac signs / horoscopes: symbols of magic and sorcery to be avoided (Deut 4:19)

Zombies: the lost who are dead in sin, the walking dead (Eph 2:1-5)
